If you need other supplies, you may want to look at the posted list for ARS 210 at the Blick website. That lists the items you may need to replenish: basic oil colors, brushes, gesso, Strathmore pads, sketchbook, etc. In particular, you should replace any brushes that are hard or worn out. The 6-brush set listed for ARS 210 on the Blick site is excellent, and good value.

ARS 320-321-420 Students:

- 1. Own the supplies required from the ARS 210 and 220 lists. Check out Blick U for those.
- 2. If you need more paint, I recommend replacing depleted Grumbacher oils with a better grade of paint. Winsor & Newton, Daniel Smith, Gamblin, Holbein, Williamsburg and Blockx are all artist-grade paints worth trying. They contain more pigment and have better physical properties. Note: there are some low-quality paints sold: Don't buy Winton, Amsterdam or Maimeri.
- 3. You may use Soft Pastel Chalk in place of oil paint. If you want to try this option, buy the largest set of Rembrandt Soft Pastels you can afford. Check the course list at Blick U, since the pastels will not be carried in the bookstore. For outdoor landscape work, pastels are easier to transport and use in the field. (Note: Don't confuse these with Oil Pastels; get **Soft** pastels.)

ALL STUDENTS will be responsible for obtaining these general supplies as needed:

- 1. hardboard panels
- 2. canvas
- 3. stretcher bars
- 4. lumber
- 5. mineral spirits
- **6.** paper towels
- 7. razor scrapers
- 8. sandpaper
- 9. drafting tape
- 10. bar soap.
- 11. If you take the course in a fall term, you will also be required to mat and frame a drawing—details provide in class.

A note on **hardboard panels:** At Lowe's hardboard is found in aisle 48, near the back. It comes in large sheets, 4 x 8 feet. There is a panel saw in the central aisle; find, it, push the call button. When a store employee arrives, have the sheet cut into 3 equal pieces, each 32" x 48". You may gesso these and store them in your vertical slot, ready to cut to size when needed.
